

– BPD stolen vehicle recovered Vehicle - \$30,000

\*\*This vehicle was recovered only 2 hours after SEU and the Training TEAM received training on the Flock system. Drugs, credit cards, a replica firearm, multiple vehicle keys, and likely stolen property recovered.\*\*

---

We had a stabbing this morning and I was able to pull up a very recent photo of his truck which provided a much better description for the BOLO. This system seems better because it gives an overall of the vehicle instead of just the plate like El sag. This led to an arrest in Colorado Springs later that same day.

----

The flock camera [REDACTED] had a hit on one of our stolen vehicles tonight. This vehicle was located and the driver was arrested for aggravated MV theft under 22-2761.

---

[REDACTED] Officer Neuzil waited approximately 10 minutes and noticed a female walking up to the vehicle. He contacted \*\*\*\* she had a total of 11 warrants (although the jail would only accept 7), a total of nearly 27 grams of Methamphetamine (Gross weight), a scale with multiple baggies, 10 checks for 8 different people, multiple credit cards and multiple W2 documents. Great Police Work and utilization of the Flock system. Email sent to Sgt. Heath and DTF.

---

Aggravated motor vehicle theft, unlawful possession of a controlled substance, obstructing a peace officer: Sergeants Scheevel/Wise observed a FLOCK alert for a stolen 2018 Hyundai Elantra bearing Colorado license DBR378, in the area [REDACTED] They observed the vehicle parked in the parking lot of the Home Depot occupied by three. A PINCH maneuver was utilized to immobilize the vehicle. All three occupants ran from vehicle. The driver, \*\*\*\* was apprehended by Sergeant Scheevel after a short foot pursuit. Search incident to arrest revealed 19 M30 pills in his wallet. The pills had a gross weight of 2.25 grams.

Officer Meehan and Officer Plyter located the female, \*\*\*\* who fled from the vehicle inside the King Soopers. After another short foot pursuit, she was taken into custody. \*\*\*\* was brought back to the police department where she was interviewed by detectives. \*\*\*\* admitted to smoking methamphetamine prior to being contact which is a violation of her protection order. She was also charged with obstruction.

Sergeant Marquez observed the third male, \*\*\*\* exit Hao Way and take off running. Officer Marquez chased \*\*\*\* to [REDACTED] where he barricaded in a back office. After a short standoff \*\*\*\* exited the room without incident. [REDACTED] He was charged with two counts of obstruction, and third degree criminal trespass.

---

On 04/18/2022, I was tracking down a possible missing CU student. Her mother hadn't heard from her in over 2 weeks. Her roommates advised that she had not been seen/heard from in 2 weeks and that she had missed all of her classes. This was after a possible fight with her B/F. Her phone was turned off and her BF's number had been disconnected. I was unable to locate the BF at his work. His boss would not tell me if he had been there recently or how to get a hold of him.

I became concerned and asked her mother for her daughter's license plate information. I utilized the Flock Camera Systems to track the vehicle. I saw that 2 weeks ago it had left the city. It came back 2 days ago and had multiple hits all over the city. After some further investigating, I was able to determine that they were OK and had eloped against their

parent's wishes. I would not have been able to put everything together without the Flock Cameras helping me track the vehicle's travel paths throughout the city. It is an invaluable tool. Not just for stolen vehicles, but for tracking suspects, people of interest, missing persons etc. Having this tool greatly increased the effectiveness of my investigation as a patrol officer.

---

Yesterday (4/18) day shift had a stolen license plate hit on Flock that led to the discovery of that plate on a stolen vehicle and the arrest of a male from Home Depot and the subsequent intel that I just emailed. 22-03571.

---

Denver Police Department received a call from a witness earlier in the evening that a female may have been kidnapped while conducting a child swap in their jurisdiction. DPD Officers and their Detectives were working on the case for several hours. The original information was that the female was forced into the car and the car left at a high rate of speed. DPD pinged the female's phone to 19th St and Balsam in the City of Boulder. We later learned that the male half was associated with 920 North St. Sergeant Graff formulated a plan and Officers from Watch 2 and Watch 3 created a contact team and attempted contact. Officer Moss made phone contact with the female who was originally reluctant to come outside. She did eventually come outside, and she said that she had voluntarily gotten into the car because their child was crying.

FYI, the Flock camera system was utilized during this call. While the image captured was from a few days prior, it was a critical piece which confirmed the vehicle has been in our city as well as provided a clear image to aid officers in their search.

---

Officer Grider, following up on a tip from other officers in reference to an ALPR notification, located an unoccupied stolen vehicle in the parking lot of the Millennium, 1345 28th Street. The vehicle itself was a steal out of Denver, but the plates were recently stolen from Boulder (22-4631).

---

Officers responded to [REDACTED] for a stolen vehicle. The vehicle a 2019 Jeep Cherokee [REDACTED] was located backed into a parking space at the Table Mesa King Soopers. The male and female suspect exited the vehicle at which point Officers moved in to take them into custody. The female \*\*\*\* was taken into custody without incident. The male suspect later identified as \*\*\*\* was able to get back in the stolen vehicle and flea westbound in the eastbound lanes of Table Mesa. The suspect drove up NCAR at which point two sets of stop sticks were placed on the road coming down from NCAR. \*\*\*\* hit both sets of stop sticks which deflated the left side tires. The suspect then slowed down and turned northbound on Hillsdale Circle at which point he was driving towards a pedestrian on the sidewalk. Officers were able to use vehicle to vehicle contact to stop \*\*\*\* before he made it to the sidewalk. \*\*\*\* then fled on foot and was taken into custody a block away. Patrol vehicle 3649 was damaged during the incident. The passenger, \*\*\*\* was arrested for motor vehicle theft and had a felony warrant for motor vehicle theft. \*\*\*\* had multiple felony warrants that the jail refused to accept. During an inventory of the stolen vehicle Officers located an empty Glock handgun case and a box of .22 caliber ammo. Officer Kirkpatrick and PTO Kaufman handled the arrest of \*\*\*\*. At the conclusion of the incident approximately a dozen residents who live in the area thanked officers for their efforts in capturing the suspects. DC Weinheimer and PIO Waugh were notified by telephone. Two media inquiries were handled about the incident.

---

Officer Kyle documented the theft and recovery of a stolen Home Depot truck. The truck had been rented by \*\*\*\* on 6/5. \*\*\*\* was supposed to return the truck on 6/6 but never did. They have attempted to contact \*\*\*\* every day since

6/6. Officer Kyle was able to use FLOCK and locate the stolen truck parked and unoccupied in front of 3223 Iron Forge Place. \*\*\*\* is unhoused and may be staying along the Goose Creek Bike Path. There is PC to arrest \*\*\*\* for motor vehicle theft.

---

Motor Vehicle Theft, Reckless Driving, Outside Warrant Arrest. Officer L. Rech arrested \*\*\*\* from 3100 34th St. #M134 after Sergeant Scheevel observed a stolen vehicle in the area of 29th and Glenwood driving erratically in an attempt to evade him. Sergeant Scheevel located the vehicle parked near building M at 3100 34tgh St. and saw the driver approaching it from building M. After learning the male was possibly inside unit M134, Officers contacted the resident and \*\*\*\* was located inside. \*\*\*\* had the key fob to the stolen vehicle in his possession and had a DV warrant authored by Westminster PD for harassment, 3rd degree assault criminal mischief and child abuse. Officer L. Rech completed the arrest.

---

Officer Grider received a FLOCK hit for a missing person out of Illinois. [REDACTED]

---

Officer Moss became aware of a FLOCK hit near [REDACTED] where a red BMW was associated with a warrant for \*\*\*\*. The warrant was an affidavit warrant out of BCSO for the original charges of 2nd Degree Assault with a deadly weapon, Stalking, Felony Menacing-Real/Simulated Weapon, and 3rd Degree Assault with the DV enhancer. Officer Moss located the vehicle off Folsom Ave and followed until additional units arrived to assist. Officer Moss noted that the driver of the vehicle matched the description of \*\*\*\* and \*\*\*\* was the registered owner of the vehicle. The vehicle drove into the cul-de-sac of Hemlock Place where Officer Moss initiated a high-risk traffic stop. \*\*\*\* was taken into custody without incident and transported to the jail for his warrants. Use of Force completed.

At about 0615 hours on May 12, 2022, Officers were dispatched to a hit and run accident on the Pearl Street Mall. A white truck had driven down the pedestrian mall and hit some fencing before leaving the scene. Officer Conley, along with other officers responded to the area and looked for the vehicle. The vehicle somewhat matched the description of a vehicle that was carjacked the prior night in Broomfield.

Officer Conley utilized the newly launched camera system to identify the vehicle based on the description from Broomfield and obtained the license plate number from the photos. At about 0650 hours, he located the vehicle just as the Broomfield Police Department confirmed the license plate number was indeed, the carjacked vehicle.

Officer Conley called out he was behind the vehicle, providing location and speed updates while waiting for other officers to set up stop sticks and respond to his location. As Officer Granberg deployed the stop sticks, Officer Conley slowed until he was able to safely pass the stop sticks and pursued the vehicle. Officer Moss took over position as the secondary vehicle and assumed radio communications. Both officers maintained their composure while attempting to plan to end the pursuit. Officer Moss requested permission to conduct a "Pit maneuver", which at the time was denied.

As the suspect continued his attempts to elude apprehension, he brandished a firearm, forcing three officers to fire rounds into the vehicle in an attempt to stop the threat to the public. Officers Conley and Moss maintained their positions while the suspect vehicle was taking fire. As the suspect continued into the RTD bus stop area, Officer Moss observed the suspect was driving towards community members. He aired that the suspect was headed towards civilians

and needed to complete a pit maneuver. Officer Moss quickly used his patrol vehicle to push the suspect's vehicle off its path, disabling it.

Officer Moss quickly moved back to a position of cover with other officers. Officer Conley began using loud verbal commands to call out the suspect. Officers used great restraint and did not approach the vehicle. Officer Conley continued commands until the suspect eventually surrendered and was placed into custody without further incident.

Both Officer Conley and Officer Moss remained calm and composed during a rapidly unfolding critical incident. They displayed the emotional intelligence and critical decision-making abilities desired in a police officer. I believe they should be highly considered for Officer of the Month.

Officer Grider/Salem received a FLOCK alert for a stolen vehicle in the area of [REDACTED] Sergeant Graff located the stolen 2015 Volkswagen Jetta bearing Colorado LWO806 and he and Officer Meehan followed it until SEU could take over surveillance. Eventually it pulled into the Home Depot parking lot where officers contacted \*\*\*\* inside the store. She was taken into custody without incident.

---

Officer Kyle received a FLOCK hit for a vehicle associated with a missing person. The missing person \*\*\*\* was reported missing to the Louisville Police Department by his mother. The CCIC entry stated \*\*\*\* [REDACTED] Officer Chartrand was able to locate the vehicle associated with Jason parked in front of 1090 Grant Place. Officers were able to determine that \*\*\*\* was associated with that address, and they contacted him there. \*\*\*\* appeared to be okay, and Officers cleared the scene. Louisville PD was made aware of the location of the missing person.

---

Officers responded to [REDACTED] reference a FLOCK hit for a stolen GMC Terrain (MI plate ARM620). The vehicle was eventually located parked on the south side of 3001 Spruce St. As Officers were setting up in the area a male later identified as parolee \*\*\*\* was observed walking away from the driver's seat of the vehicle. \*\*\*\* was contacted at gunpoint just east of the vehicle and arrested without incident. \*\*\*\* was also arrested by BPD in June of this year while in possession of a stolen car. He is associated with apartment #M134 at 3100 34th St where numerous stolen vehicles have been recovered over the last few months.

DV/Stabbing – Known suspect – Officers were able to quickly enter the suspect vehicle into Flock on a Hot List. They also were able to pull a recent, high-quality picture of the vehicle from Flock for a BOLO, which was subsequently provided to Colorado Springs PD who was in the area of the suspect's PING and quickly located the suspect vehicle in a Walmart parking lot and placed the suspect into custody.
