PROJECT TITLE	Oconto and Dobson Outfall Improvements
SUMMARY	<p>Project would consist of a new storm sewer to capture stormwater runoff and convey it to a new outfall to the North Branch Chicago River. Approximately 6,200-feet of new storm sewer (which includes some separation from existing combined sewers) would be installed along with constructing a new outfall to the North Branch Chicago River.</p> <p>The relief storm sewer installation would take place in an area served by both storm and combined sewers that are typically overwhelmed during storm events. The upgraded sewer pipes provide capacity to convey surface water from impacted areas to minimize surface water flood damages and reduce the frequency of sewer backups. This project provides protection to approximately 11 homes. Benefits from the project were modeled using the detailed overland flooding mapping component of the XPSWMM 2D model.</p>

SUMMARY	<p>Project consists of an upgrade of existing sewer lines to increase capacity during larger storm events. A detention facility will also be constructed to store water during storm events as well. Project includes the construction of storage basins to detain stormwater runoff to reduce the peak flow through the storm sewer system at Maryland Street and Milwaukee Avenue in Niles. A combination of above-ground and underground storage would be utilized for this project.</p> <p>This project serves to provide relief from surface water flooding. The detention basin will provide storage for surface water runoff to further minimize flooding on residential property, along with local streets and intersections including the major thoroughfare of Milwaukee Avenue. This project provides protection to approximately 83 homes. Benefits from the project were modeled using the detailed overland flooding mapping component of the XPSWMM 2D model.</p>

SUMMARY	<p>This project involves the construction of a 1,650 foot segment of the North Branch Trail (NBT) from the intersection of Touhy Avenue and Caldwell Avenue to the existing North Branch Trail located south of the Bunker Hill Picnic Grove.</p> <p>The proposed NBT connection directly addresses several GO TO 2040 policies specified by the Bicycle and Pedestrian Task Force. The project promotes an alternative mode of transportation and will provide a vital connection to existing portions of the NBT and the Touhy Triangle, which is targeted for development and redevelopment opportunities (see https://www.vniles.com/985/Touhy-Triangle-Master-Plan). The NBT will provide a dedicated off-street route for both bicyclists and pedestrians, minimizing their interaction with vehicular traffic while also minimizing the occurrence of pedestrian and bicycle-related crashes.</p> <p>Included in the extension will be traffic signal modifications and a pedestrian crossing at the intersection of Touhy Avenue and Caldwell Avenue providing access to the Caldwell and Touhy bus stop and shelter.</p>

PROJECT TITLE	New Material Storage Facility
SUMMARY	The Village of Niles proposes to remove its existing salt dome and replace it with a structure that is large enough to store the amount of salt that is used in an average year. The structure would also be used for indoor storage of stone, sand and miscellaneous equipment and pipes.
PROBLEM	The current salt dome has limited capacity. Salt has to be ordered continuously and supplies are restricted by deliveries. We are not able to always receive the best price available for salt because we require strict delivery specifications to ensure we don't run out of salt. Aggregate materials which are currently stored outside are exposed to the elements and can wash away and freeze among other problems.

PROJECT TITLE	Milwaukee Avenue & Ballard Road Intersection Improvement
SUMMARY	To improve traffic flow at the above referenced intersection, one lane would be added to the east approach of Ballard Road, tapering back to the current two-lane pavement further east. A sidewalk is proposed for the south side of the east approach on Ballard Road and the east side of the south approach on Milwaukee Avenue. Existing signal equipment would be relocated and improved.
PROBLEM	The Ballard approaches to the intersection experience high levels of congestion due to the single lane approach on the east and the two lanes on the higher volume west approach. The lack of sidewalks to the east combined with the very narrow east approach forces pedestrians and bicycles to compete unsafely for pavement space, especially in inclement weather. Sections of Ballard Road are without sidewalks, handicap ramps, or pedestrian lights and with a narrow right-of-way.

SUMMARY	Installation of streetlights along Golf Road from Dee Road to Washington Street.
PROBLEM	The addition of street lighting in this area is needed to provide adequate safety and security in the nighttime environment. The project areas are as follows: Golf Road - from Dee Road on the west to Washington Street on the east, a distance of approximately 1.5 miles.
	The design of this project shall use LED lighting and provide for the installation and implementation of a wireless adaptive control and management system which will allow the Village to electronically manage the operation of the streetlight infrastructure on an individual real-time basis. The streetlight poles will have the structural capacity to support hanging flower baskets, banners, flags and holiday decorations, as well as supply 220V electric to the holiday decorations during peak and sustained wind gusts.

PROJECT TITLE	Leaning Tower Rehabilitation
SUMMARY	Construction of Leaning Tower of Niles was started in 1931 and was completed in 1934 as a part of recreational park at that time. Last repairs of the tower were performed between 1995 and 1996, improving the structure, façade and the plaza area. Most of the distress observed at Leaning Tower of Niles is caused by water infiltration through the exterior surfaces.
PROBLEM	Moisture stays trapped within the cavities. Trapped water freezes during the winter months and expands in volume. The increase in volume produces pressure on surrounding concrete, causing it to crack and existing cracks to widen, allowing even more water to penetrate into the cavity of the exterior walls and slabs.
