In 2022, there were a total of thirty-five (35) incidents where Oak Park Police Officers initiated contact with vehicles due to a FLOCK Alert. Of these contacts, seventeen (17) incident resulted in the identified vehicle fleeing from officers and was not apprehended. The eighteen (18) other stops include three (3) arrest made by Oak Park Police and six (6) vehicles that were still reported stolen in LEADS but had been recovered by the owner and had not reported recovered to LEADS. There were eight (8) incidents where the vehicles and all occupants were turned over to other agencies, and one (1) incident in which an Oak Park Police Officer made a stop on a vehicle without verifying status through LEADS. Additionally, there were a total of three (3) firearms recovered in the above listed vehicles (1 by Oak Park and 2 turned over to other agencies).
